Environmental Project Officer

The Ministry of Environment, Industrial Branch is seeking a multi-talented individual with a strong engineering and scientific background to deliver results-based environmental protection programs throughout the province of Saskatchewan.

As an Environmental Project Officer for the Potash and Central Operations Section in Saskatoon, you will be responsible for the administration of regulatory programs, assisting in policy and legislation development, and resolving complex environmental and public health issues related to the province's ongoing development of mining, industrial, commercial, and impacted sites programs. You will have demonstrated ability to work alone or in a team in achieving goals and environmental protection initiatives within the above 4 program areas. You will require excellent communication and public relation skills along with an ability to negotiate and engage in problem solving and conflict resolution.

The successful candidate will have knowledge of environmental issues and environmental protection processes associated with mining, industrial and commercial operations, storage of hazardous materials, spill response, air emissions, and decommissioning/reclamation of impacted areas. An understanding of engineering and science related to industrial applications will be required in order to work with stakeholder groups within the potash mining and heavy industrial upgrading and refining industry, as well as some larger commercial operations. You will also be expected to successfully complete a NFPA 472 Hazardous Materials Technician Course and participate in the Provincial hazardous material response program.

Typically, the competencies required for these positions would be achieved through a degree in Engineering or Science combined with related environmental work experience.

The ability to travel to remote locations of the province and to work flexible hours is a requirement of this position.
